Organisations and initiatives in which ACCIONA is participating in preparation for COP22:

UN – UNITED NATIONS

Since 2005, ACCIONA has been an active member of the UN's Global Compact, with a commitment to incorporate the Global Compact's Ten Principles (dealing with human rights, labour, the environment and anti-corruption) into our activities.

Global Compact LEAD: ACCIONA has been a member of the Executive Committee of Global Compact LEAD since early 2014. The goal of Global Compact LEAD is to attain new standards in environmental, social and government action, and to establish a new benchmark for corporate sustainability.

Caring for Climate: C4C is a joint platform of the UN Global Compact and the UN Environment Programme. It was created to enhance the role of business in the global strategy against climate change and to raise awareness among governments and public institutions about the need for mitigation.

Science-Based Targets

Leading companies are taking initiatives to set ambitious climate goals and seize opportunities during the transition to a low-carbon economy. Setting science-based targets for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and capping global warming at 2°C is an effective mechanism for companies to address climate change and promote the global development programme.

Sustainable Energy for All: SE4All seeks to combine the efforts of government, the private sector and civil society to achieve three major objectives by 2030: universal access to modern energy services, improve energy efficiency by 40%, and produce 30% of energy from renewable sources. ACCIONA's Chairman, José Manuel Entrecanales, was appointed to the Advisory Board in 2013.

CORPORATE LEADERS GROUP (CLG)

CLG:

CLG is a group of European business leaders who share the conviction that there is an urgent need to develop new policies to combat climate change. ACCIONA joined The Prince of Wales's Corporate Leaders Group on Climate Change (CLG) in 2009.

In March 2016, ACCIONA signed the declaration by the Coalition for High Ambition, which comprises members of the Corporate Leaders Group, representatives of local government and civil society, calling on European leaders to fulfil the commitments adopted at COP21.

Green Growth Platform: Linked to the CLG, the Green Growth Platform focuses on influencing the EU's climate and energy policy for 2030 through tools and meetings between CLG business leaders and senior EU officials.

Fossil Fuel Subsidy Reform Communiqué

Friends of Fossil Fuel Subsidy Reform (FFFSR) calls on the international community to step up efforts to phase out subsidies for fossil fuels.

ACCIONA adopted this communiqué in December 2015 during COP21 in Paris.

Green Growth LATAM: On 30 March 2016, the Environment Ministers of the Pacific Alliance announced the creation of the 'Green Growth Platform'. In a communiqué, Peruvian minister Manuel Pulgar-Vidal highlighted the initiative's objective: To promote climate action between the member countries of the Pacific Alliance to achieve the sustainable development goals.

The initiative has been adopted by Chile, Colombia, Mexico and Peru.

Spanish Green Growth Group: The Spanish Green Growth Group's roots are in the business world with the aim of working with companies and governments to create a roadmap towards a low-carbon economy. In pursuit of leadership in the medium or long term, the companies in the Group seek to demonstrate their commitment to incorporating climate policies into their business strategies.

WBCSD

World Business Council for Sustainable Development (WBCSD)

WBCSD promotes sustainable practices in business: José Manuel Entrecanales, Chairman of ACCIONA, was a member of the Executive Committee, which oversees WBCSD's long-term strategy and vision, until 2015.

Low Carbon Technology Partnerships Initiatives (LCTPi)

During 2015, ACCIONA and other companies in the industry jointly led the Scaling up Renewables project, which seeks to drive renewable energies within the Low Carbon Technology Partnerships Initiatives (LCTPi).

The initiative, backed by over 140 companies and 50 partners, seeks to accelerate the development of, and transition to, low carbon technologies, raise the emission reduction targets and accelerate technology development, by supporting progress in renewable energy to achieve 1 TW of installed capacity by 2020.

CDP (Carbon Disclosure Project)

Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP)

CDP is one of the global systems for disclosure of corporate environmental performance which accredits excellence on the part of suppliers of products and services based on low-carbon business models.

Paris Pledge for Action.

ACCIONA joined the Paris Pledge for Action, a call by companies, investors, cities and regions from around the world for rapid and effective implementation of the agreement reached at COP21 in Paris to combat climate change and cap global warming at 2°C, and to ensure that climate change is combated effectively.

WE MEAN BUSINESS

We Mean Business: This is a coalition created in September 2014 by CLG, the B-Team, Business for Social Responsibility, CDP, Ceres, The Climate Group and WBCSD with the goal of accelerating development of a low-carbon economy.

WORLD ECONOMIC FORUM

World Economic Forum: In 2015 and 2016, ACCIONA participated in a number of events at the Davos Forum, where business leaders, politicians, journalists and intellectuals have been meeting since 1991 to analyse the problems facing the world, including environmental issues.

CEO Climate Leadership Group

At the World Economic Forum in Davos in January 2015, ACCIONA's Chairman, José Manuel Entrecanales, participated in the launch of a new work group comprising CEOs of world-leading companies to drive the private sector's contribution to combating climate change.

WORLD BANK GROUP (WB)

World Bank Group (WB): This is a specialised international agency within the United Nations system. In the area of climate change, it promotes carbon pricing initiatives.

Carbon Pricing Leadership Coalition

The Carbon Pricing Leadership Coalition (CPLC) brings together leaders from government, business and civil society to foster political support for designing and implementing carbon pricing policy and helping to pave the way for carbon pricing.

CPLC High Level Assembly

ACCIONA participated in the high-level assembly of the Carbon Pricing Leadership Coalition (CPLC), held in Washington DC. It is an initiative of COP21 to drive the implementation of effective systems for pricing carbon emissions with the goal of reducing them and slowing global warming.
