- (1) ACCIONA SA reports the Scope 1, 2 and 3 GHG emissions generated to facilitate the calculation of this indicator to its investors. Please refer to the rows below:

  Scope 1 GHG emissions refer to direct emissions occur from sources owned or controlled by the company

  Scope 2 GHG emissions refer to indirect emissions are from the generation of purchased energy

  Scope 3 GHG emissions refer to those indirect emissions that are a result of an organization's operations, but are not owned or controlled by the company. ACCIONA Scope 3 categories include:

  (1) Purchased goods and services; (2) Capital goods; (3) Fuel and Energy-related activities (not included in Scope 1 or 2); (4) Upstream transportation and distribution; (5) Waste generated in operations; (6) Business travel; (7) Employee commuting; (8) Upstream Leased Assets; (9) Use of sold products; (10) End-of-life treatment of sold products and (11) Investments.
  - **Note:** Due to the unavailability of Nordex's Scope 3 emissions data, this data has been calculated based on the Scope 3 emissions/sales ratio averaged between 2020 and 2022 (535 tCOe/M€ sales) of the company.
- (2) Formula used for calculation:  $\frac{Non-renewable\ energy\ consumption}{Total\ energy\ consumption}x100$

Total energy consumption includes renewable (i.e. biomass, biogas, bioethanol, biodiesel, hydrogen and purchased renewable electricity) and non-renewable energy (i.e. diesel, fuel oil, natural gas, petrol, propane, LPG, non-renewable purchased electricity and district heating).

- (3) In ACCIONA, 100% of the company's operational assets are assessed for their potential impact on biodiversity and protected areas and are included in the corporate ESG Risk Management System. Furthermore, every ACCIONA site that may affect protected areas and the surrounding biodiversity have carried out specific environmental impact studies and have defined environmental monitoring and remediation plans to ensure nature protection.
- (4) ACCIONA Water division carries out desalination and water treatment processes. During these processes, the quality of the water captured and discharged is monitored and it is ensured that it complies with all the applicable regulation and quality standards. These activities do not discharge pesticides or other chemicals which may disturb the quality of the water.
- (5) ACCIONA complies with the ten principles of the UN Global Compact related to human rights, labour, environment and anti-corruption. In addition, it also respects the fifteen principles and two recommendations included in the "II. General Policies" section of the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises. In this regard, ACCIONA does not lack processes and mechanisms to monitor compliance with UNGC principles and OECD Guidelines to Multinational Enterprises:
  - The Guiding Principles for Ethical Action & Conduct, as well as the Conduct Principles included in ACCIONA's Code of Conduct, clearly draw attention on the commitment of the company to respect all human rights and public freedoms recognised in the United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights and that all of ACCIONA's people must follow this commitment, conducting their professional activities while respecting human rights and public freedoms. In addition, there is a Human Rights Policy applicable to all employees of ACCIONA, that reflects the commitments and principles of ACCIONA in relation to responsible business conduct.
- (6) For the calculation, a weighted average (per category) of the following formula has been used:

(7) Formula used for the calculation:
